FRAZIER-PARK LAKE OF THE WOODS PLANNING PROJECT CONFERENCE CALL

Dave Warner began by updating the group on Claim #2. Although work continues on the project, most of the claims are being handled through Self-Help Enterprises. He recommended waiting until December to submit the claim, which will include Frazier Park board meetings and staff time. The claim will coincide with the quarterly reports required by the State, due the first day of January, April, July and October.

Dee Jaspar continued the meeting by going over the work on acquiring the three test well sites:

1. After several attempts to contact them through a letter and phone calls, a new letter was sent to Soledad Enrichment Action (SEA), from the FPPUD attorney, asking permission to enter the property to conduct the geophysical survey. It also stated that the District would take further action if needed. It has been about three weeks since that letter was sent and there has been no contact. Legal counsel has been instructed to file a petition with the Superior Court for access. It is estimated to cost about \$4,000 - \$5,000 in legal fees for this petition.

Lawrence Sanchez said legal action could potentially be covered under the grant but will be addressed when the time comes. The regional system will be built on whatever water sources are acquired, so he believes it justifiable to do what is needed to secure the best possible site. Lawrence also offered to go down to their office and contact the CEO in person, in order to help find a more amicable solution.

2. Emily Wainwright owns two parcels that have a frontage area up against Cuddy Creek. Communication has been open with her, and she is willing to allow the District to conduct the survey, then move on from there to a test well or even a production well. A sample agreement that can be signed by the landowner and the District for property access was sent to the attorney for review and comment.

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3. A third site was identified, across from the park, on the other side of the creek. It took a lot of research to locate the owner, who lives out of the area. Dee was able to get in contact with the property manager, who indicated they are familiar with this process. He believes the owner will have no problem working with District, and will give that recommendation.

Lastly, Dave Warner asked the State for permission to move money allocated to District staff reimbursement (about \$20,000), over to the line item for board meetings (currently \$9,000). \$7,100 has already been submitted under Claim #1 for board meetings. The FPPUD board as a whole will discuss exactly how much they want to ask be moved, then an email can be sent to Lawrence.
